Disciple Maker Index: Our Mother of Consolation Results

<u>Overview:</u> In March 2022, there were 249 electronic surveys (98% completed) and four paper surveys completed for a total of 253. I will report on the various subsets beginning with the three strengths and three opportunities. Most of the survey contained a Likert scale to respond to various statements (strongly agree, agree, neutral, disagree, strongly disagree). In reporting the data, I will use an agreement index, that is, I will add the percentages of strongly agree and agree. Please note that if there is 76% agreement to a statement most of the remaining percentage is usually the neutral option, with few percentage points on the disagreement index. There is some repetition in this report as some statements fell into various categories. We published this report two pages at a time in the bulletin. I invite you to share any insights, questions, or concerns with a member of the Parish Pastoral Council, Finance Council or to me.

Strengths and Opportunities

Strengths

I would recommend the parish to a friend. 91% I would recommend the pastor to a friend. 91%

- 1.) How many ministries are you involved in? 3 or fewer (67%), 4-6 (25%), 6-10 (8%)
- 2.) Top three most influential factors that keep parishioners connected in life of the parish: (first) Relationship with other parishioners, (second) relationship with pastor, (third) celebration of Eucharist {4th: service & outreach, 5th: parish hosted social activities}
- 3.) Most important reason to encourage community service in our parish: it builds community (50%), Jesus calls us to serve the poor (50%), it creates an opportunity for encounter (50%)
- 4.) Mass time most attended: 4:30 Vigil (33%). 9:00 (42%), 11:00 (17%), 7:30 (8%)
- 5.) Five expectations of community for pastor: (a) celebrating the sacraments, (b) preaching, (c) vision & direction, (d) providing pastoral care, (e) teaching the faith {empower service & outreach to poor tied in sixth place}
- 6.) Two desired take aways from a homily: (a) hope, (b) call to action

- 10.) Three areas of growth for the parish: (a) more volunteers participating in ministries, (b) more young people involved, (c) more catechesis on Church teaching
- 11.) Community values that describe the OMC culture (high to low): (a) access to sacraments, (b) social justice, (c) sharing faith with others, (d) prayerfulness, (e) stewardship, (f) family focused, (g) diversity & inclusion, (h) parish tradition, (i) service & outreach
- 12.) Assessment of financial health of the parish: we are usually in the black but never complacent (50%), we hold our own but there's not a lot of room for extras (42%), we had some ups and downs and are shooting for stability (8%)
- 13.) Assessment of physical shape of church building: lots of beauty! Recently renovated and/or really-well maintained (67%), lots of character! Really nice structure and "bones" but needs some normal cosmetic renovation or improvement
- 14.) Assessment of physical shape of other buildings (rectory, parking lot, parish center); Good! We could use more space & there are a few projects needing attention, but it is well within the parish's reach (50%), Great! We have sufficient space for our needs & everything is in good shape (33%), We make it work! Our current space limits us in our ministries and communities and we don't have sufficient resources to improve it at this time (17%)
- 15.) The preferred method of bringing others to Christ: leading by example (67%), one-on-one conversation (33%)
- 16.) To what degree do we need to change in order to be best fulfill our mission in the next five years? In a really good place right now and need to do more of what is working (58%), on right track and need some minor tweaks (33%), getting a little complacent, time to look toward the future (8%)
- 17.) The phrase that best describes relationship between parish school and parish from your perspective:
 - **Of one heart**. There are some distinct "school families" & "parish families" but all believe in the importance of the school (57%)
 - **Of one mind**. Share space & resources, but as our parish changes there seems to be a need to build a stronger bridge between the school family and the parish family (29%)
 - Of one mind and heart. I think our parish and school families consider themselves one in the same and there is excellent integration between the two (14%)

What's Next? Each parish needs to establish three core priorities (what we want to accomplish in the next 24-36 months). Each priority must meet three criteria: (a) it takes more than one parish group to accomplish; (b) it's complex enough that it cannot be delegated; (c) it's important enough to merit the pastor's attention. The archbishop's intent is that this helps us focus on our call to be missionary disciples. Sadly, only 12% of Catholics in the US are in a relationship with the church (attending). We want to welcome back all to our worshipping community, so that together we may give thanks to God for all we have received and strengthen one another in our faith journey. We need God. This world desperately needs to reclaim God as the source and summit of their lives. Let's get busy!
