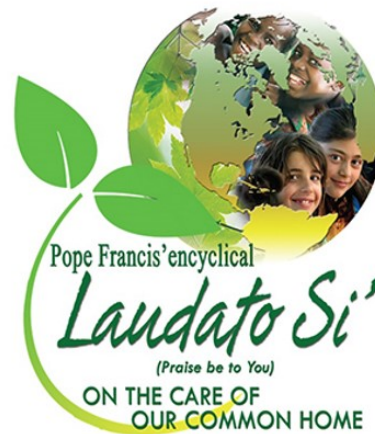


My Journey with *Laudato Si*, On the Care of Our Common Home
