Home-based Lesson: Study and be able to answer Confirmation Questions # 1-20 when you return on March 4

1. What is a Sacrament?

A Sacrament is the visible sign of God’s invisible grace. The Sacraments are instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church.

2. How many Sacraments are there in the Catholic Church?

There are seven Sacraments in the Catholic Church. They are Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, Reconciliation, Matrimony, Holy Orders, and Anointing of the Sick.

3. What is the purpose of Sacraments?

The purpose of the Sacraments is to make us holy, to build up the Body of Christ, and to give worship to God.

4. What are the Sacraments of Initiation?

The Sacraments of Initiation are Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

5. What Sacraments are the Sacraments of Healing?

The Sacraments of Healing are Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick.

6. What Sacraments are Sacraments of Service?

Sacraments of Service are Matrimony and Holy Orders.

7. What is Confirmation?

Confirmation is the Sacrament in which the Holy Spirit comes to us in a special way to enable us to witness to Jesus both in word and deed as committed Christians.

8. What is the Holy Trinity?

The Holy Trinity is one God in three Divine Persons - God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

9. Who is the Holy Spirit who comes to us in Confirmation?

The Holy Spirit is the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity.

10. How does the Holy Spirit come to us in Confirmation?

The Bishop extends his hands over those to be confirmed and prays that they may receive the Holy Spirit. He anoints their forehead with Chrism in the form of a Cross.

11. What is Sacred Chrism?

Chrism is a sweet smelling mixture of olive oil and balsam, which is added to the oil for its fragrance. It is consecrated by the Bishop at the Chrism Mass on Holy Thursday. It is a sign of the strength the Holy Spirit gives us to carry out our Mission with Jesus.

12. Why is the “Renewal of Baptismal Promises” part of the Rite of Confirmation?

The renewal of Baptismal Promises is part of the Rite of Confirmation because it shows the intimate connection between Baptism and Confirmation. At Baptism parents and godparents made these promises for me. In Confirmation, I profess my baptismal promises and make public my intent to live my faith more deeply.

13. What does the Bishop say when he confirms?

Bishop: (Name) Be sealed with the Gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Confirmandi: Amen.

Bishop: Peace be with you.

Confirmandi: And with your spirit.

14. Why does the Bishop anoint the forehead with Chrism in the form of a cross?

The Bishop anoints the forehead with Chrism in the form of a cross to remind us that we must openly profess and practice our faith and never be ashamed of it; rather die than deny it.

15. What is the effect of the Sacrament of Confirmation?

Confirmation increases sanctifying grace and gives us a spiritual character that helps the one who receives it to publicly profess and defend the faith.

16. Why is there a Sponsor for Confirmation?

The Sponsor at Confirmation presents the person to be confirmed to the Bishop for anointing. They help and support the confirmed person in their daily witness of Christ and in their on-going faith formation as a Catholic.

17. In what form did the Holy Spirit come upon the Apostles at the first Pentecost?

The Holy Spirit came upon the Apostles at the first Pentecost in the form of tongues of fire.

18. Who is the ordinary minister of the Sacrament of Confirmation?

The Bishop is the ordinary minister of the Sacrament of Confirmation. *Bishop Joseph Martino* will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation at OMC Parish this year.

19. Why do we focus on service to others during this time of preparation?

Through our Baptism we are all called to serve one another as disciples of Jesus. Focusing on service as we prepare for Confirmation helps us to grow in a lifelong commitment to serve others as Jesus did and to witness to our faith as disciples on Mission with Jesus.

20. Describe one of your service projects and what you learned by doing it?

(Answers will vary... Bishops generally like to ask this question!)

21. What are “Gifts of the Holy Spirit?”

The Gifts of the Holy Spirit make it possible for us to do what God asks of us. They are wisdom, understanding, right judgment, knowledge, courage, reverence, and wonder and awe.

22. What are “Fruits of the Holy Spirit?”

The Fruits of the Holy Spirit are examples of the way we find ourselves acting because God is alive in us. They include: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

23. What name did you choose for Confirmation? Why did you choose it? Tell me something about the Saint whose name you chose.

24. Who is the leader of the Catholic Church in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia?

The leader of the Catholic Church in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia is Archbishop Charles Chaput.
